

- Federation of Finnish Learned Societies, in short TSV, is a cooperative body of 300 bottom-up research communities. Societies unite researchers and experts across organisations, fields and sectors to advance research and dissemination in their fields.
- As an independent public umbrella organisation, TSV facilitates and coordinates national level policies and activities, such as open science and responsible researcher assessment.
- According to a recently published survey, the members of learned societies agree that advancement of open science, research integrity and research assessment should play an important role in their societies' operations.
- Learned societies can and should be strongly and strategically engaged in responsible research and assessment for the full benefit of science and society.

Julkaisufoorumi / Publication Forum

- Publication Forum classification (in short, JUFO) has been developed by the Federation
 of Finnish Learned Societies (TSV) since 2010 to support performance-based funding
 system for allocating part of core-funding annually to universities (at macro-level).
- The main rationale is to reward universities not only based on quantity but also for publishing in channels that are valued by the scientific community, are robust in terms of peer reviews, and reach the widest critical expert audience.
- JUFO classification of journals, conferences and book publishers provides a comprehensive coverage of the Finnish universities' publication output including all fields, publication types and languages.
- Field-specific panels of experts identify peer-reviewed publication channels (level 1), and indicate those that have the widest respect and strongest impact in the research community (levels 2 and 3)
- Levels 2 and 3 are updated every four years and the new classifications were published in the beginning of 2023.



Long-term development plan 2023-2027 finalized during spring



- TSV is a member of CoARA and committed to supporting the entire Finnish research community in its journey towards quality focused assessment culture that recognises the full diversity and impact of academic work.
- Reform plan by the end of 2023 and one cycle of implementation by the end of 2027:
 - 1. **JUFO-classification:** assess needs to change JUFO-classification and user-guide (how many levels, how to use JUFO responsibly)
 - 2. **JUFO-portal:** develop JUFO-portal as a national source of broader range of information (e.g. editorial and quality assurance procedures, openness)
 - 3. Diverse outputs: support data collection and assessment of diverse research outputs: publications to professional & general audiences, preprints, datasets, software, etc. (e.g. output definition, channel and platform criteria and identification)
 - **4. Assessment forum:** use of national expert-panels evaluate broad range of outputs, contributions, and impacts so these can be responsibly recognized and rewarded in assessments
 - 5. Impact assessment: develop Impact Assessment framework to support institutional research assessments with strong focus on societal relevance and interaction.
